March for an End to Violence

So far this year, 706 people have been shot in Chicago, 130 fatally. While the numbers are down from the previous four years, every life taken by violence is one too many.

Every year since 1995*, the Alliance of Local Service Organizations (ALSO) has organized a **Walk for Peace**, to call our community to end the violence that has claimed too many lives and destroyed too many families. This year's Walk for Peace will be held on **Saturday**, **May 25**, **starting at 1:00 pm**. The march will begin at the corner of California and Division and will proceed through Humboldt Park, ending with a family-friendly event.

*The first Walk for Peace began at Kimball Avenue Church, so we have a long history of support for ALSO's efforts to reduce violence.

"70 Acres in Chicago" & The Death of Cabrini Green

Almost 25 years ago, the Chicago Housing Authority announced a 10-year "Plan for Transformation" that would turn existing public housing developments into "mixed-income communities." The plan has never been completed. On **Wednesday, May 8**, you are invited to view the documentary "70 Acres in Chicago" that follows the destruction of Cabrini Green and the failure of CHA to keep its promise. The film will be shown at **New Life Community Church, 2958 N. Damen, at 6:00 pm** followed by a panel discussion featuring the director, CHA residents and public housing advocates.

Other CHA properties—including Lathrop Homes at Diversey & Clybourn—sit unfinished while thousands of families sit on the waiting list.
